who had been instrumental in getting him the parish,
dated Jan. 8. 1844, - re the unpleasantness in his
parish and the charges made against him especially by
a man named Thomas Hughes who had said he prohibited
them from reading the Bible. The real Cause of Hughes's
hostility (he was a small farmer) was that Baker had
rebuked him for interfering with some dependents of
Lady Stewart. Bp. of Meath to Primate, Jan. 11.

Lady Stewart. Bp. of Meath to Primate, Jan. 11, sends this letter, says Baker's predecessor Murray and the Presby. Minister used bring their respective flocks alternately to each other's place of worship, and that the parish was full of dissent. Even Sir Hugh Stewart was against Baker, chiefly because Rev. Howard B. St. George his father-in-law said he was destitute of Christianity. The Bp. describes St. George "if he may be called a Churchman 1s of the lowest grade & mad into the bargain & impatient of contradiction".

May it please your Grace the Parishioners of the Parish of Ballygawly were greatly Surprised at the Lecture delivered on your visit with us, wherein your Grace Blamed the Persons who Seperated from Mr. Baker's communion Alledging that it is through the Gentlemen's influence that the poor have left the Church, but it can be proved that it was the Middleclass and neither the rich or poor that found fault with Mr. Baker's conduct first; and your Grace further Stated that Mr. Baker is our authorised ambassador from Christ and that we ought to obey him as Such, but I do not know any part of Scripture which authorizes us to think that a Minister after Ordination becomes infallible for St. Peter Denied his Master after being called by Christ himself, and Judas the' Bumbered with the Eleven Sold his Master afterwards and I presume Dr Pusey was Lawfully ordained altho. tis allowed on all hands that his Doctrine is dangerous so that I think we are Justified in Separating from a Minister who teaches that he can forgive us our Sins, and that he must offer up our prayers to God for us and produces our Prayer Book in Support of that Doctrine Whereas we as Protestants hold that it is Jesus Christ that pardoneth and absolveth all them that truly repent and unfeignedly believe the Gospel, and not Mr. Baker, and St. Paul tells us that in the latter times there would arise false teachers who would attempt to pervert the Gospel of Christ but the' He or an Angel from Heaven would preach any other Gospel unto us. let him be accursed and St. Paul also enjoins the reading

of the Scriptures, and Mr. Baker forbids us to read them. So that we are only following the Injunction of St. Paul by Separating from him, We know that it is in your Grace's power to continue Mr. Baker with us, and it is also in our power to let him continue to preach to empty walls altho' it is painful to our feelings to be Separated from the Church which your Grace was Instrumental in Building for us and for which we are Grateful, and also for the three former Ministers Which if either of them had continued with us we would have Still a flourishing Congregation not as it is now trusting to a few, as your Grace might understand by the Bumber of Candidates which attended for Confirmation, that I think there was not more than the one third of the Children of the Parish present. When I asked a Man what was the reason that he did not offer his children he Said he could not Conscientiously present them through Mr. Baker, and that he was Informed that Mr. Baker had threatened to have any of the neighbouring Clergymen Censured if they would offer any Children of his Parish So the Man thought it more prudent to refrain offering them this time than to bring any of the Ministers whom he respected under Censure So that we are awkwardly Situated in this parish at the present time and we thought your Grace would not have allowed of Such doctrine as it is a means of making Dissenters of a great number of our Congregation.

In the County of Louth, no screable composition for tithe is made, either by the 3/- 7 Incumbent, or the Lay Impropriator. In the Irich Parish of ardee, the same course is pursued by both, & the same principle of valuation adopted. A view is annually taken both for the Rectorial & Vicarial tithes. The Viewer generally at a very low calculation & then values the tithe, at the market price p barrel. At the time of viewing the market price of corn is generally at the lowest rate during the year; & a great advantage is usually allow-ed even on that price to the land occupier. Thus, if the market price of Wheat be 25/- p barrel, the Viewer charges only 20/-; & in the same proportion for other odd sums. In the parish of Kildemock, part of the Union of Ardee. Wheat was valued in 1823 at 20/- p barr: & computed at only 6, 7, & seldom at 8 barr. p scre. It rose in the course of the year to 387 40/- p barr: & was at the time of the view from 257- to 277- p barrel. A further deduction is generally made from the Valuation, & in some cases a considerable one, before a bargain is a promissory note is then given for the amount finally agreed on, of which payment is not de-manded until the ensuing harvest, & frequently does not take place, until the end of two years.
